Set up a homework station where you can see the device, and if it doesn't look like homework it probably isn't. 



Social media app built around creating, sharing, & viewing user created music videos.





WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW


- Intended for users 13+
- Can livestream (create live videos) within the app
- Explicit lyrics & mature content can be found on the app
- Parents can set time limits & turn on restricted mode to help filter out inappropriate content
- Videos can be set to private or public. Public allows anyone with the app to view the video.
- Videos created or posted in Tiktok are the property of the app and can be shared by the company
- The app collects location as well as information contained in the messages sent in Tiktok



WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW

- Intended for users 13+
- Can collect birthday, email address, & contacts
- Share information to business partners such as advertisers
- Can collect & share location within the app
- Collects images & other information from the device's camera roll and photos
- May share information with other snapchatters, business partners, and general public
- Users can flag inappropriate content on the device
- Snaps never really disappear. Friends can screenshot images from snapchat.



Set your account to private from the Instagram app on your Android or iOS device

- 1. Go to your profile, then tap \equiv .
- 2. Tap O Settings.
- 3. Tap **Privacy** > **Account Privacy**.
- 4. Tap next to Private Account to make your account private.

Set your account to private on your computer or mobile browser

- 1. Go to instagram.com on your computer or mobile browser.
- 2. Click A, then click .
- 3. Click Privacy and Security.
- 4. Below Account Privacy, click to check the box next to Private Account.
